PlaNet Finance to host the first ever "International Microfinance Awards"

On October the 28th PlaNet Finance celebrates its 10th birthday by hosting the first ever "International Microfinance Awards" – an occasion which will recognise the achievements of the world's top microentrepreneurs.

PlaNet Finance – the microfinance organisation

25,000 people across the world die from poverty and hunger every day. Within this global geopolitical and economic context, microfinance has emerged as one of the most effective weapons in the war on poverty. It gives people the means to turn their plans for creating their own businesses into reality, offering them a life-changing escape route from poverty.

2.3 billion people live on less than \$2 a day. Over the last fifteen years, microfinance has enabled 150 million of them to gain access to loan facilities. The people who benefit from these loans are all too often ignored by the big development projects run by governments and multilateral institutions. Thanks to microfinance, however, they have been able to develop gainful economic activities and to improve the lives and living standards of their families.

Today, 10,000 microfinance institutions (MFIs) are working alongside state-funded initiatives and around 100 specialist private funds to promote and develop microfinance.

Since it was established in 1998, PlaNet Finance has contributed to improving the performance of MFIs by providing technical support, rating services and advice for funders. It has opened up new ways of strengthening the impact of microfinance: particularly in areas like insurance and new technologies and through investing in newly-created MFIs.

The world's top microentrepreneurs of 2008 will receive their awards at a ceremony at the **Institut du Monde Arabe** on Paris' Left Bank. The awards ceremony will be held on **Tuesday October the 28th at 6 o'clock** and has been organised by PlaNet Finance as part of its 10th birthday celebrations.
